

Ariadne helps those using private resources for public good achieve more together than they can alone by linking them to other funders and providing practical tools of support.












The reality of restricted funding



42% of NGOs have less than three months' operating reserves

of civil society organisation had unrestricted reserves equivalent to 21 days or less of annual expenditure

53% of NGOs face deficits in over two of every five years






Flexible Funding Works
